

Dashboard is
Released

The City of Sacramento has released a <u>Crash</u> <u>Dashboard</u>, which provides recent info on when, where and with whom crashes are happening around town. It is a big step towards

rebooting efforts for <u>Vision Zero</u>, along with the newly conceived <u>Tactical Action Group</u>, which will allocate six engineers to work on quick-build projects that rapidly design and construct low-cost infrastructure projects. Advocates and the Active Transportation Commission have been pushing the City to get serious about the high number of fatalities and injuries on our roads, and it looks like steps are finally being taken. Given that another cyclist was killed two days ago, this can't come soon enough.



The *Streets for People* Draft Plan is available for review and comment through April 6, 2025.
